Concept: The TATA Management Training Center was originally to be an institute to train about 50 trainees at a time. There was to be a building attached and sensitive to the original Wittet design. Initially a dining room was added, followed by a library. A significant renovation was done to the bungalow from the interior. Thereafter a series of bungalows designed as trainee guest quarters were designed to sit in the landscape.

The scale of the buildings are subtle, and the play with transparency and opacity make this design somewhat humble and unique. Today the institute is used for a variety of different purposes and has seen many a luminary walk its hallowed halls. The center has constant management interaction with other premiere institutes in India as well as Harvard University
